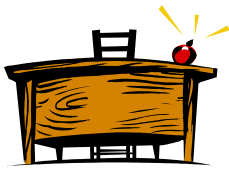

## Important for **BOTH**

### Classes:

### Skills

- To use crayons, markers and paint

- To count from 1 to 10
- To identify primary colors and shapes
- To recite days of the week and months of the year
- To celebrate all holidays and seasons of the year
- To identify all letters of the alphabet
- To identify & understand the number concepts 1-10
- To match and sort objects
- To work puzzles

## MMO 4 & 5 Year Old Class

### Skills

- Use crayons, markers and paint

- To count 1-30 & by 10s to 100
- To identify primary colors and shapes
- To recite days of the week, months of the year
- To celebrate all the holidays and seasons
- To understand opposites
- To match, sort and group objects
- To identify what comes next & before
- To demonstrate pre-math and prewriting skills
- To identify all letters and their sounds
- To blend vowels with consonants
